Entry by SafeWork Inspectors

Fact Sheet October 2013



We suggest you assert your rights, comply with your obligations and take steps to ensure the Inspector lawfully exercises his or her powers on entry. The following is a non exhaustive list of matters you should turn your mind to.

- Has the Inspector shown identification and advised what section of the Work Health & Safety Act 2012 (SA) (Act) permits entry?
- Has the Inspector notified you of the purpose of the entry as required by s164?
- If entering under s165 he or she must only exercise those powers. S165 does not allow an Inspector to interrogate but he or she may make inquiries.
- If the Inspector is asking specific questions about a
 particular incident ask what section of the Act is the
 Inspector exercising when asking the questions? He or
 she must be exercising s171.
- Is the Inspector purporting to ask questions on entry of an individual person or an incorporated entity?
- If an individual person is that person entitled to rely upon the privilege of self-incrimination set out in section 172 and therefore decline to answer questions or produce documents on the grounds that the answers or the documents tend to incriminate them?
- Remember s269 says you and the entity do not have to disclose information that is subject to legal professional privilege
- Remember you are entitled to obtain legal advice as to your rights and obligations before providing

information to an Inspector

- If the Inspector has asked you to provide documents has he or she made that request by written notice as required by section 171(2)?
- Ask which section of the Act he or she is purporting to rely upon to obtain the documents?
- Closely examine the relevant section. If Section 171, has the Inspector complied with the requirements set out in 173. In other words, has the Inspector identified himself or herself; warned you that a failure to comply without reasonable excuse would constitute an offence; advised you as to the effect of section 172 (self-incrimination); and importantly s269 (legal professional privilege)?
- Is the request for information made under s155? If so, does the Inspector have a delegation from the Executive Director?
